

NO alcoholic beverages are allowed - Sorry!







What's New in

Cohoes?





A bank, commercial and residential construction projects are in the works for 2017. Downtown's revitalization will see more than \$9 million in residential and construction developments.

Mayor Shawn Morse delivered his "State of the City" speech recently.

Capital District City Real Estate Investment Team (CDREIT) will invest \$5 million in a White Street project, while Capital

Companies NY will spend \$4 million to renovate six Remsen Street properties, the Mayor said.

A block away, on the northwest corner of Mohawk and Ontario, Pioneer Bank will open it's first branch in Cohoes.

Morse said, "Remsen Street is coming back. It's going to be the premier street in the Capital Region."



Most of Morse's speech concentrated on his accomplishments during his first year in office.

He saved the economic news for the end.

Daniel Odabashian of CDREIT said that "Remsen Place, a \$5 million development of 20 apartments and 9000 square foot of commercial space will be built at 12 White Street."

Daniel Oh of Capital Companies NY said "his firm would invest \$4 milion revitalizing 95, 103, 109, 113, 122 and 130 Remsen Street Properties.

These projects, Morse said, would build off the \$3 million renovation of the Cohoes Hotel. Cohoes has received \$1.44 million in grants in 2017.

The Franklin Delano Roosevelt Bridge, built in 1932 and dedicated to Governor Franklin Roosevelt is being replaced. The new bridge is just to the east of the old one, which will be torn down. New aproaches and a revamped Ontario-Saratoga and 787 intersection are in the plans. Completion of work is scheduled for late 2017.





The northwest corner of Delaware and Ontario Streets is the new home of a new Cumberland Farm Convenience Store and gas station.

The old store at Park Avenue and Ontario has been razed. The Cohoes riverfront is certainly changing. With all the new housing on Delaware Avenue, it should be a very busy store.

Captain's Lookout is about two thirds finished. It is comprised of 90 luxury apartments looking out over the river. Hudson Square is also under construction across Delaware Avenue bordered by Van Schaick CC, Van Schaick Mansion and the pond.


