

We alum can all be very proud of our Cohoes High School girl's softball team.

The team defeated a strong Ichabod Crane squad, 1-0, to lock up the State Section-2 Class B championship.

Two of the players, Lily Sencer and Isabelle DeChiaro, are headed off to college with softball scholarships.

Coach Frank Ryan said the team played most of the season with just nine players.

The blue and gold champs included DeChiaro, pitcher; Lily Sencer, shortstop; Adrianna DeVoe, catcher; Asa Kerr, first base; Marley Dame, 2nd base; Hail Burgess, third base; Megan LeBuis, right field; Jordan Brown, center field and Meghan LaPlante, left field.

Seventeen-year veteran coach Ryan was awarded Coach of the Year for his third sectional title. This year, the team ended with an 18-6 won-loss record.

Lily Sencer has been awarded a four-year Div. 1 scholarship to Hartford University; Isabelle DeChiaro a four year scholarship to Div. 1 Siena College.

"I can't say enough about her," Ryan said of DeChiaro. "She missed only two games in six years!" Her record from the mound was 73 wins, 15 losses.

DeChiaro is quick to give credit to her teammates for those numbers: "Our team defense was solid," she said. "It was the reason we won lots of games." International (non-conference).

At Siena, she will play under coach Bill Lajeunesse, a 1979 graduate of Cohoes High. He said he expects DeChiaro will compete right away for pitching time as well as a position player.

Among Siena opponents next season are Maris, Ion, Fairfield and Monmouh; Army, Cornell, Syracuse, Michiga State, Florida State.

"I'm pretty excited,"DeChiaro said.

"Her ability is up to her," Lajeunesse said, "She's very competitive."

Dr. Hans Holzapfel Trust



In accordance with his wishes Dr. Holzapfel directed in his will that one hundred thousand dollars be entrusted by Cohoes High School to fund a Life Sciences Scholarship. The School District is not allowed to invest in the higher return investments and returns on CD's are currently very low.

Through an agreement reached with the The Trust Executor, Linda Leventhal and Cohoes School District twenty five hundred dollars a year will be provide for a Scholaship in Dr. Holzapfel's memory.

Barbara McDonald with Superintendant Spring are responsible for initiating this agreement. Good work. This will be a great addition to Awards Night and

a great way to honor the memory of generous CHS Alum.

Hans escaped Germany ahead of the "Holocost". He was lucky enough to have his mother's friends, Doctor and Mrs. Hans Weiss sponsor his immigration to Cohoes.

His admission to RPI was denied because he had not completed or didn't have proper documentation of his education in Germany. Principal Madelon Hickey and the faculty of Cohoes High School arranged to prepare him for college entrance exams which he passed.

He went on to receive a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology. He entered Rensselaer Polytechnic graduated with a Medical Doctorate before moving on for Medical training in Santa Barbara CA. Hans dedicated his life to the medical field, working as emergency physician and in many family practices over the years. His commitment to the field is matched by his humble attitude. Holzapfel joked; "My only claim to fame is that i've never been sued!" He certainly has a claim to fame in Cohoes these days.

Hans also begueathed two other Scholarships to RPI and Albany medical College totaling six hundred thousand dollars. Local student will reap the benefits of these gifts for many years to come.



In my sophomore year at Cohoes High School I was drifting through keeping just enough grades to stay with my Mrs. Mary Dotter and Mrs. Mary class.


