New Future-Ready Pathways Program puts students on track to graduate with Regents diploma and associate's degree.

New York State Education Department Smart Transfer grant will provide \$839,301 over four years for early college high school initiative.

Nov. 13, 2017--Earlier today, the entire Cohoes High School Class of 2021 learned of the school's new Future-Ready Pathways program--a collaboration between the district, Hudson Valley Community College and University at Albany--that provides year-round mentoring and support to 25 students as they pursue a Regents diploma and 60 college credits before graduation, all at no cost to families.

"Future-Ready Pathways begins with you, the members of the Class of 2021, because you're just beginning high school," said Superintendent Jennifer Spring, Ed.D. "This is an incredible opportunity for you and the payoff will be immense. You'll be well ahead of your peers, whether moving on to college or planning for a career."

Students have the option to choose one of four career exploration pathways: Computers, Engineering and Technology; Health Science and Human Services; Early Childhood and Adolescent Education; and Business and Communications.

"This path is rigorous and you will need to work hard, stay focused and be determined," added Dr. Spring.

Students will be expected to attend summer classes, which will be held at either Hudson Valley or Cohoes High School and participate in extended learning time after school. There will also be opportunities for career exploration that support the four Future-Ready Pathways as students will be required to complete internships as part of the four-year commitment.

Students must submit an online application to enroll in the program. They must also have an 80 percent overall average, write two essays and provide teacher references to be considered.

Preference is also given to those students who are first generation college goers, English language learners, minority, or would not traditionally have access to higher education after graduation. In addition, 13 of the 25 students must also be classified as socio-economically disadvantaged as determined by income eligibility for free and reduced-priced lunch.

"The purpose of this program is increase the number of our students taking post-secondary coursework and give those students access to higher education when they may not otherwise consider it an option for their future," added Dr. Spring.

*The online application also requires that the student's parent or guardian agree to support the child's decision to enroll. The deadline to apply is November 30, 2017 and can be found here: **Future-Ready Pathways Application***



Dr. Hans Holzapfel



In accordance with his wishes, Dr. Holzapfel directed in his will that one hundred thousand dollars be entrusted by Cohoes High School to fund a Life Sciences Scholarship. The School District is not allowed to invest in the higher return investments and returns on CD's are currently very low.

Through an agreement reached with the The Trust Executor, Linda Leventhal and Cohoes School District, twenty five hundred dollars a year will be provide for a Scholarship in Dr. Holzapfel's memory.

Barbara McDonald with Superintendent Spring are responsible for initiating this agreement. Good work. This will be a great addition to Awards Night and a great way to honor the memory of a generous Cohoes High School Alumnus.

Hans escaped Germany ahead of the Holocaust. He was lucky enough to have his mother's friends, Doctor and Mrs. Hans Weiss sponsor his immigration to Cohoes New York.

His admission to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute was denied because he had not completed or didn't have proper documentation of his education in Germany. Principal Madelon Hickey and the faculty of Cohoes High School arranged to prepare him for college entrance exams which he passed.

He entered Rensselaer Polytechnic and went on to receive a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Albany Medical center before moving on for medical training in Santa Barbara CA. Hans dedicated his life to the medical field, working as emergency physician and in many family practices over the years. His commitment to the field is matched by his humble attitude. Holzapfel joked; "My only claim to fame is that I've never been sued." He certainly has a claim to fame in Cohoes these days.

Hans also bequeathed two other Scholarships to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Albany Medical College totaling six hundred thousand dollars. Local students will reap the benefits of these gifts for many years to come.
