#### From the Editor...

This third issue of our newsletter has a feature that is personal for me and, I believe, for many of our alumni. In the first two issues of our newsletter, we have given profiles of the generous, caring people whom we proudly call our founders; in this issue, we feature a profile of the amazing woman whose selflessness, works, and vision led directly to the Cohoes High School Alumni Association as we know it. Madelon K. Hickey was an educational force of nature whose name is forever synonymous with Cohoes High School. Everyone who attended or taught at CHS between 1946 and 1966 has a Principal Hickey story to tell--whether she "discussed" your attempts as a student to sneak up the marble "down" staircase, to surreptitiously open your locker door during class time, or your attempts as a teacher to share a "cold one" with other teachers at a local neighborhood tavern after school on a Friday. She knew every student by name and his/her family tree; she had a gift for recognizing potential in every student and for working to help him/her realize that potential. Ms. Hickey practiced "tough love" before it even had a name! When her remarkable foresight told her that future students would need more advanced course offerings, better science labs, a proper gymnasium and athletic programs, etc., she knew that the "old" CHS would not be able to meet those demands and Cohoes children would suffer for it. She began her crusade to build the "new" school on Elm Street; many Cohoesiers have long believed that CHS should wear her name. One of the greatest gifts of my life was to be a student during her tenure at CHS.

Most other high school alumni associations exist primarily to maintain and increase communications among their alumni. Our purpose, as set by our founders, has always been to provide financial support to our graduating seniors; we have succeeded because of the incredible generosity of our alumni. I would like to extend a personal "thank you" to my fellow alumni for their support, and to the Board members with whom I am privileged to serve. They are an amazing group of devoted, caring, and supportive women who give freely of their time and talent to help the children of CHS. We truly appreciate alumni contributions and the notes with positive feedback; please continue to share with us. ## Awards Ceremony 2023...

On Tuesday, June 20, 2023 at 6 pm, Cohoes High School held its annual Awards/Honors Ceremony in the auditorium to honor and recognize the achievements of the Class of '23 in the presence of graduates' families, friends, and guests. The program began with opening remarks by Superintendent Peggy O'Shea and Board of Education President Margaret Giller. Principal Laura LePage Tarlo introduced this year's valedictorian, Quincy Hytko, salutatorian, Carissa Shanahan, and honorable mention graduate, Jaylynn Bariteau. #### Madelon K. Hickey---a profile

Anyone who knew Cohoes High School between 1930 and 1970 recognizes the name "Madelon K. Hickey", which came to be synonymous with the High School itself. Miss Hickey embodied the life spirit of the School, the aspirations and accomplishments of its students and its teachers. She was a constant advocate for quality, innovative education in Cohoes and for instilling in students and teachers a strong sense of their own worth and capabilities. Any Cohoesier of those decades can readily recall his/her favorite Miss Hickey story; she was definitely a "force to be reckoned with". She held her students and staff to very high standards, but those were the same standards to which she held herself.

A lifelong Cohoesier, Madelon K. Hickey was born on July 7, 1910, and was a lifelong communicant of St. Bernard's Church. She graduated with top honors from St. Bernard's/Keveny Memorial Academy and graduated magna cum laude from the College of St. Rose with a triple major in Latin, English, and Education. Later, she earned her Master's Degree and certificates of administration and supervision from New York University and New York State College of Teachers (now State University at Albany). Miss Hickey began her educational career in 1930 in the Cohoes school system, teaching elementary grades; in 1936 she began to teach English and then Latin at the High School, in addition to serving as coordinator of language instruction. In 1946 she was named principal of Cohoes High School and served in that role until 1966 when she assumed the newly-created position of Curriculum Coordinator of Grades K-12. Even in this new role, she continued to be a driving force in the District and provided much of the leadership for the building of the new high school on Elm Street. Ill health forced her to retire in 1970.

In the educational world of Madelon K. Hickey, there was no doubt that teachers were to teach, and students were to learn. Miss Hickey always projected her unswerving belief in the capabilities and potential of both students and teachers. Often, she had more confidence in people than they had in themselves, and she inspired them to see life's obstacles as merely that--obstacles to be overcome, not permanent barriers to success or happiness. Many Cohoesiers benefited from her secret generosity as she anonymously paid for necessities from school supplies to haircuts to sneakers to college application fees, tuition and books. She was never slow to criticize a student's bad behavior, but she never demeaned the person committing that behavior.

Madelon K. Hickey died on October 12, 1972 at the age of 62, but her spirit and inspiration continue in the hearts of all who were privileged to know her.

#### Did you know...

For today's CHS alumni, our alma mater was that stately building "on the hill" of Columbia and Bevan Streets, or the more modern structure further west, on Tiger Circle at the end of Elm Street. Did you ever wonder, though, where "high school" classes were taught before those buildings existed?

According to Masten's *The History of Cohoes*, and *Images of America: Cohoes Revisited*, and other sources, the first actual high school in Cohoes was the Egberts Institute which was established in 1864. A Cohoesier named Egbert Egberts, a prominent industrialist and philanthropist, rented one of his buildings on the corner of White and Mohawk Streets to the trustees of the Egberts Institute. In 1868 the facility was renamed the Egberts High School, whose first class graduated in 1872. Growing student population and educational needs led to the building of the first Cohoes High School which opened in 1919 on a parcel of Lansing family real estate at the corner of Columbia and Bevan Streets. The first principal was Charles "Pop" Wheeler who had served as principal of Egberts High School since 1914. The main entrance of the first CHS faced Columbia Street and was proudly topped by a beautiful clock adorned by an eagle with outspread wings. Two stone plaques also marked this entrance and greeted visitors to the "old" high school. One plaque reads: "Through letters, arts and science to citizenship"; the other reads: "Dedicated to all the children of all the people". This building served as Cohoes High School until 1969 when the "new" High School opened on another parcel of Lansing family land at the end of Elm Street. This CHS provided a larger capacity and a design structure better-suited to the needs of the newer generations of students. Even this "new" CHS has since undergone further renovations and entrance redesign in 2010-2011 in order to continue to meet safety and curricular demands and energy efficiency.

The "old" CHS, of course, became the current Cohoes Middle School. In 1997-2000 that building underwent extensive renovations to better serve its students; the remodeling included expansion of the library space and moving the main entrance to the Bevan Street side of the complex.
